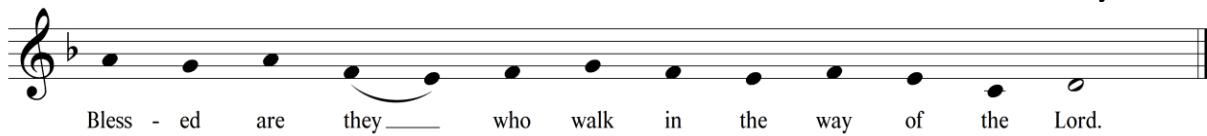

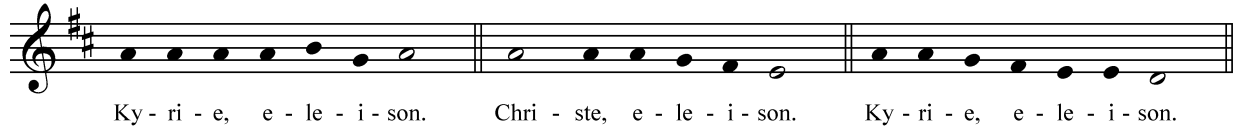



The Eucharistic Prayer begins with a dialogue between the Priest and the assembly.

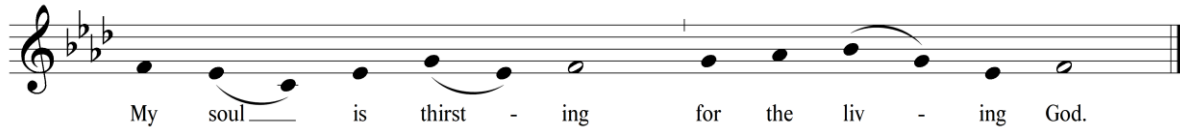
